# SPURGEON ON PROPHECY

Charles Spurgeon, probably the greatest preacher England has ever produced, was confronted by prophecy toward the end of last century. Apparently there was a group claiming that Jesus would re-

rn in 1866 and the following coments on prophecy are taken from a sermon preached in 1862.

'You know I am no prophet. I do not know anything about 1866; I find quite enough to do to attend to 1862. I do not understand the visions of Daniel and Ezekiel; I find I have enough to do to teach the simple Word such as I find in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John and the Epistles of Paul. I do not find many souls have been converted by exquisite dissertations about the battle of Armageddon and all those other fine things. I have no doubt that prophesyings are very profitable, but I rather question whether they are so profitable to the hearers as they may be to the preachers and

publishers. People have been panting to know the future; and certain divines pander to this depraved taste, by prophesying for them, and letting them know what is coming by and by. I do not know the future, and I shall not pretend to know. But I do preach this because I know it, that *Christ will come*, for He says so in a hundred different passages. I will not divide the house tonight by discussing whether the Advent will be pre-millennial or post-millennial, or anything like that, it is enough for me that *He will come*.' (1862, p599)

# PROPHECY IN THE FAMILY

Many years ago a certain member of our family decided, on leaving school, he wanted to be a journalist. In those days there were no university courses in journalism but many big city papers ran their own in-house schools of journalism. He applied to one of them and was accepted.

After a number of months of training, he was told that tomorrow he started work. This was the real thing. He was to report to an old sub-editor for his first assignment.

The day came and there he was standing beside his boss's desk wondering what his first assignment would be. The old sub-editor looked him up and down and thought for a moment. Then he reached across his desk and picked up a file and put it in front of our new journalist saying, 'Write the stars for the next three months.'

How many assignments did we waste our time on over the years, until we found the one that really mattered? — the Gospel

# **Dear Friend**

Disillusionment is a real and devastating experience that comes to everyone at least once in their lives. Look around your street, your city, your church or your club, you will see that there are individuals who are disappointed, baffled and disgusted. One who has had no success in relations with the opposite sex, will roundly declare that all women are a snare; all men are cruel. Another will scoff at the very idea of marriage, holding, that all



marriages are imprisonment. Another, will curse the government and politicians generally. Others will sadly and solemnly declare that all Christian churches and all denominations are institutions for the oppression of mankind. Still others will tersely complain that life itself is vicious, that there is no justice. And so it goes. Voices, (some of them our own) are raised continually, crying that life has let them down. Disillusionment is as common as ageing and we need to beware of the damage it can do. It takes two things to fell a big tree, a high wind outside and decay on the inside. Too often cynicism is nurtured within until it causes massive spiritual decay and makes the individual an easy mark for the next windstorm. At the beginning of the French Revolution, Wordsworth was lifted to great heights of enthusiastic expectancy. But as the Revolution unfolded, he saw how the promise of liberty, equality and fraternity was lost amidst the horrors of the bloody guillotine. At the end, Wordsworth felt that the French Revolution had let his generation down. He wrote:

'I lost
All feeling of conviction, and, in fine
Sick, wearied out with contrarieties
Yielded up moral questions in despair.'

Many reading this letter, will see themselves in Wordsworth's lines. For myself, I can say that disillusion-ment has lurked about me. Therefore, I remark to myself also, when I say that I am aware that much disillusionment springs from self-pity. We feel sorry for ourselves. Life has not been fair to me! The danger in this is that disillusionment will rob our generation of our talents and services. It is possible to be so soured by life's experiences, that pity for oneself deafens us to other calls for help. Life's very ability to disappoint us, ought to inform us somewhat as to our duty.

Aside from our own frustrations there is the tragedy of the whole world before us. What is to be done about the hideous raping of our once pristine environment? Who will speak up on its behalf? Who will stand up for the catastrophic plundering of the world's poor by richer nations? Who will strive for a better and more just society? Who will try to curb the withering advance of drug abuse with all its related woes? Who will try to dam the tide of alcoholism? This generation needs you. This generation needs me. Why should we be lost to it? What's the use?, says the soul disillusioned. What can one person accomplish?

Such questions are asked by minds that demand to see results of their labours within their lifetimes. But we have no right as Christians to make such a demand. It may take a hundred or a thousand years for one dedicated life to bare its fruit. Think of Christ, the world in which he was born was controlled more or less, by a world view, which held that life was merely a vain and eternal recurrence, leading nowhere. Into that disenchanted age Jesus came; lived and died an apparent failure. But he shook the foundations of human civilis tion, changing the complexion of men's minds. Said one ancient sage, 'He hath changed sunset into sunrise'. Now Christ's Church faces again a disenchanted civilisation. What shall we say to it? What can we do? Will we allow the bruisings of body and spirit that have come to us to stop us thrusting ourselves into the maelstrom of human need? Will we, by the grace of God, march into the thick of human strife, shouldering other peoples burdens; with Christ on our lips and in our hearts; his strength in our arms and in our legs, till our life is done and we have exhausted ourselves in a cause far greater than ourselves?

# What Is Christianity?

'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die'. John 11:25-26

They left Jerusalem and Judea because of continuing threats on the life of Jesus. Now the small band was in the region of Perea, close to Jericho. But even here they could not get away from death. The news ame by a messenger, 'Lazarus is sick and near death.' But Lazarus and his sisters, Martha and Mary, lived in Bethany of Judea, just outside of Jerusalem. For many of the Disciples, it seemed foolish to even think of going into such a dangerous area. Jesus waited two days before announcing that they would go back to Judea. He spoke, as he often did, in figurative language, 'Our friend Lazarus is asleep, I am going to wake him up'. As often happened, the disciples tried to understand Jesus's words literally. Jesus then explained, 'Lazarus is dead.' Thomas, not known for his cheerful and positive outlook on life, reonded, 'Great, let's go back into Judea and we can all die with him.' They didn't talk much as they walked to Bethany. The disciples' hearts were heavy. They reluctantly followed Jesus into Judea. And Jesus did not reassure them that nothing would go wrong. In fact, he knew that he was in the last few days of his own life.

#### Martha Believed

Hearing that Jesus was coming, Martha left her sister, Mary, to continue preparing food while she went out to meet Jesus as he neared Bethany. Grief-stricken and still in shock at what had happened, Martha shared her burden with Jesus, 'If you had been here, Lazarus would still be alive. But maybe you can still do something. I know God will give you whatever you ask.'

Jesus looked deeply into Martha's eves and said, 'Your brother will be resurrected.' Martha believed there would be a future resurrection to life. She had heard Jesus speak of it, and felt that he was comforting her now. 'I know Jesus. I know that he will be resurrected at the last day.' This was the setting for the words lesus now spoke. Words of comfort that Christians hear at funerals as corpses await burial. Words that have been preached from tens of thousands of pulpits. Words that millions have memorised. John records them. 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die'. (John 11:25-26) Jesus did not preach these words at a gravesite, or in an open-air stadium at an evangelistic rally. He looked intently at Martha and explained, 'I am life. Life is me. The resurrection - it's me'.

#### Do You Believe?

Most of us usually end our recitation of John 11:25-26 without including the two last sentences. The last sentence is a question that reminds us that Jesus originally spoke these words to Martha. But the last sentence is much more than just a question to Martha. These probing words are a call to all who will follow Jesus. These words are a challenge to you and me. 'Do you believe this?' Here is the Gospel. God, in the person of Jesus, came to die that we might live! Jesus was, and is God! The second Person of the triune Godhead came in the flesh, lived among us and went to the cross for our salvation. We struggle with sin. We are helpless in the face of sickness and death. We are captives of time and space, knowing that death will have its way with each of us. And we know that our own sin, our sinful condition, sentences us to death. It is inevitable. Each of us, on our own death row, awaits our date with death. But there is good news! We can be pardoned. We can be rescued from our

hopeless condition and inevitable sentence of death. God came outside of time and space, and entered into it. He came from immortality to mortality. He took a body of flesh and empowered that body with his divinity. To rescue us! To save us! Do you believe?

#### 'Who Am I'

Martha quietly affirmed the same words that Peter had earlier. Jesus had also pressed Peter to make a commitment (Matthew 16:13-16). He asked Peter, 'Who am I Peter?' Neither Martha nor Peter said anvthing about what a good example Jesus was. They did not explain that Jesus was a respected teacher of values and ethics. They said nothing about Jesus' prophecies, nor did they speak of his healings. They both affirmed that he was and is the Christ, the Son of God. Both Peter and Martha knew about Jesus. They had spent time with him and they had observed him. They watched him and came to know much about him. But Jesus eventually pressed them for a more intimate and lasting commitment. Jesus Christ wanted to know if they believed. He wants nothing less from us. Do you believe? Perhaps the Jesus you know is the Jesus you know about. You may know about his life and his teachings. You may know his parables. You may have studied what he said about the future. You may be intensely interested in the date of his second coming. Perhaps you have been taught that he came to set us an example, and if you can only do exactly what he did, then you will be good enough to be given salvation. But do you believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, the only source of life? Does that belief change your life?

### **Come To Christ**

You know how the story of Jesus, Mary, Martha and Lazarus ends. Following Jesus' conversation with Martha, Mary also left the house to see Jesus. She also told him that if he had been there, surely he

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

wouldn't have let Lazarus die. Death and grieving were everywhere. Mary and Martha were in tears, their friends were weeping. It was the custom to hire mourners. who wailed and shrieked in the background. The air was heavy with hopelessness. Life was in their midst in the person of Jesus, but death controlled and ruled their attitudes. Jesus Christ knew that he, too, would soon meet death - and overcome it. He knew that he would atone for the sins of the world on the cross. He would claim victory for all who would believe in him. When he came to the tomb and asked them to take away the stone that sealed



#### Dear Editor

It is encouraging to see the way the Holy Spirit is working through the World Wide Church of God by their public recognition and acceptance that justification by faith alone is the way of eternal life. Their world leader Pr J Tkach made a public apology for his church's past dogmatic approach to certain dogmatic beliefs and their intolerance to other Christians.

Dr Ford's major impact to the *Adventist Church* from the 1960's to the 1980's was on Justification by Faith. Since the crisis of the 1980's Dr Ford has single handed caused the *Adventist Church* world wide to shift its major focus on this doctrine.

The only reason Dr Ford raised the problem of the Investigative Judgement publicly, is that he believed you cannot do justice to the gospel of Justification by Faith alone, with acquittal of all sins upon God's forgiveness to the sinner, and at the same time present a doctrine which teaches Christians will be investigated sometime after 1844 to see if worthy to have their names retained in the Book of Life!

The Adventist Church and its leaders could take a little direction and example in the way the World Wide Church of God handled its past mistakes as now revealed in their public statements. I am not suggesting that the Adventist church take the same position the World Wide Church of God took on the Sabbath doctrine - they still meet on Saturday for worship but no longer hold it binding on New Testament Christians.

To resolve the injustices of the past, the *Adventist Church* needs to make public apology. As a gesture of Christian friendship and brotherly love Dr Ford should be we comed in the spirit of the wonderful and marvellous Gospel that he still preaches.

it, they thought he wanted to view the body. Martha protested, 'But he has been dead four days. The body is decomposing and it stinks horribly'. The command of Jesus, 'Lazarus, come forth!' is high drama. We can almost hear the wailing stop, we can almost see the faces as they peer intently into the face of death. Life was commanding the tomb of death to give up its hold on the dead.

#### A Call to New Life

Jesus calls us to the same new life. From our own spiritual bondage and decay. But before we can have the new life in Christ, the gravestone must be rolled away. We must be willing to look into the jaws of death. We must confront the

chains, addictions and beliefs that bind us, and come forth. As he called Lazarus to new life, the Life and the Resurrection sealed his own death warrant. On another day, not many days later, Jesus again took on the forces of death and sin, and overcame them once and for all. He triumphed on the cross, that we may have life. And three days later, he himself came out of the tomb. He proved irrefutably that he was God in the flesh, by rising from the dead. It was the sign that he gave to prove that he is Messiah, Redeemer and Lord. He triumphed over death and the grave! Do you believe?

# Once Saved Always Saved?

Question to Dr Ford from the recent Brisbane Seminar:

In Romans chapter 11 it talks about people being cut off and being put in the fire. Does this mean that we who are Christians can lose our salvation, or are we saved forever?

Answer: The New testament repeatedly says 'We don't believe that we too will be cut off'. Read chapters 9,10 and 11 of Romans. If we cease to believe; if we cease to trust; faith is like breathing - you can't do it once and forever, you've got to keep trusting. We don't mean by that, a moments lapse and your out, we don't mean that at all. But if you give up the habit of looking to Jesus, you will certainly lose him. The whole book of Hebrews is about this. It says that 'The just shall live by faith, but if that man turn back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him.' (See last verse of Hebrews 10)

The Bible does not teach 'once saved always saved' but it does teach 'looking unto Jesus always safe', even if you are in the mud when you are looking. Even when you have just 'blown it.' If you are looking, if you are trusting, even when you are a failure, you're right! You're OK.

While recognising their responsibilities to past affiliations, the Board expressed their wish to make known the Gospel to all



- 3) Nine new Members were voted into GNU.

On payment of a once only fee of \$20 and acceptance by the Board

of GNU, applicants become voting Members of a Limited Guarantee Company. This legal entity enables GNU to spread the Gospel via different channels - magazine, audio & video tapes, seminars, books & radio.

4) It was decided to include selected materials from *People To People* resource group from USA, for inclusion in the GNU catalogue. Material available includes books and tapes by internationally known author and speaker, Bob George.

Later this year Members will be asked to elect a new Board to take over and steer the affairs of Good News Unlimited in Australia for the next two years. Firstly, nominations will be called for, then later, the Ballot will take place. If, by the way the Lord is leading in your life, you believe you have a contribution to make to the work of Good News Unlimited, then please give consideration to nominating. Currently, there is no one on the Board from South Australia or Tasmania, also there is another serious deficiency for this day and age - there are no women on the Board. 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
