Editorial

The spreading of the gospel has always been fraught with obstacles and difficulty—the devil has always made sure of that. The Lord Jesus when he spoke was continually confronted by enemies and detractors. The Apostles also had continual opposition, with most of them eventually dying the death of martyrs.

When every Christian down through the ages has confessed Christ as his or her Saviour, then told someone the gospel, they have exercised the God given right of freedom of speech which governments of all nations down through the ages, including our own, have sought to suppress.

In 1 Corinthians 1:23 the Apostle Paul says, 'But we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block (offence) and to the Greeks foolishness.' He well knew the passions for and against the gospel that powerful preaching would raise up.

With God, you are either for or against his Son and the gospel he presents to you, there is no middle or neutral ground where you are safe to stand and watch. In the Roman Empire Christianity was an unauthorised religion, so Paul in exercising freedom of speech to promote it, was frequently in trouble.

In the western world today we have this right to freedom of speech but you still need to be courageous and brave to use it. Most people are scared of being different to the majority around them, or are cowed by the bullying of political correctness, so never speak when they should.

In October 1997 three women in their mid twenties were street preaching on the steps of Wakefield Cathedral in northern England. According to a newspaper report they were challenging passersby as to their standing before God. A hostile crowd formed, the police arrived and arrested the three women for obstruction. They were subsequently brought before the local magistrates court and convicted.

They appealed to the Crown Court at the beginning of this year and lost. So they then appealed to the High Court, which upheld their appeal. The judge, Lord Justice Sedley, said in his judgement, 'There was no obstruction, nobody had to stop and listen.'

He went on to say that, 'There could not be any breach of the peace if what was said was inoffensive, but free speech is not just the inoffensive but includes the irritating, the contentious, the eccentric, the heretical, the unwelcome and the provocative—provided it does not tend to provoke violence.'

When the gospel is presented it is often unwelcome or irritating, even provocative because it can challenge people to the depths of their hearts.

Many are carrying the guilt of personal and private unconfessed sin that they refuse to acknowledge. But God sees all, nothing is hidden from his eyes. He is looking intently into the hearts of all as 'it is his will that none should perish but all come to repentance'. The letter to the Hebrews says, 'For the Word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two edge sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from his sight, but all things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account.'

As a practising Christian you will be ready to speak the gospel and testify to your own salvation and the assurance you have of enjoying eternal life with the Lord.

To some listeners your words may be inoffensive, but if to other listeners your words are irritating, contentious, eccentric, heretical, unwelcome or provocative; then rejoice for the work of the Holy Spirit is going forward and he is challenging yet another soul with the gospel.

Jesus' death on the cross has paid the penalty for the whole of humanity. This is the Good News that must go to all the world. We have to be like the three women on the steps of the Wakefield Cathedral and never cease to exercise our God-given right of freedom of speech.

Focus on the Sospel

When Paul and Barnabus came to Lystra, they preached the good news of Jesus and healed the sick. When the crowds saw miracles, they were ready to deify the two missionaries. but Paul spoke earnestly, bid-

ing them to observe that they were only humans; bearing witness to God, who had not neglected to leave evidences of himself in the world.

In another place Paul said, 'The kindness of God leads you toward repentance' (Romans 2:4). In this passage he discusses that kindness.

The natural world contains clues to God's character—rain, sunshine, growth and fruition are signs of his goodwill. While drought and famine scar the landscape, the ancient promise still holds true for the earth at large—'Seed-time and harvest shall not fail.' Nature hints at God's goodness by its lavish beauty. Mountain and sky, tree and river offer their advertisement that God is lovingly disposed to his creatures. 'God's invisible qualities, his eternal power and divine nature have been clearly seen, also being understood from what has been made' (Romans 1:20)

God bears witness to himself in the common mercies of life—his provision of food and the filling of the hearts with Joy.

There was a wealthy man who lived a careless life. He never thought to thank God for home, wife and children. One day he arrived at his house after a long absence. He was greeted at his door by his dog, who met him with every display of canine glee: leaping, barking and wagging his tail. The rich man's dull spirit was stirred by the animal. He began to think of all he might be equally happy for. He thought of God, and changed his life, turning his revenues toward humanitarian service.

Later, when people would ask him how he began in the work he was doing, he would reply, 'My dog's tail caused my conversion.'

The common mercies of life ask us the question . . . What have you that you did not receive? They also suggest a further question . . . What shall I render unto the Lord for all his benefits towards me?

Most clearly, the divine love is seen in God's grace. Immense though the evidence in nature and providence is, it does not compare to the 'riches of His grace'. The harvest may be plentiful, but what is it beside the Bread of Life? Which, if a man eat, he shall never hunger nor ever die! Jesus is God's unspeakable gift.

God has filled the universe with things that indicate his mercy. Nature and providence combine to point to the most compelling attestation of all. Namely, the Christ who suffered for us, bearing away the sin of the world.



I have some comments on Daniel 8:14 which I would appreciate your opinion of. Many have said that to believe in the 1844 calculation, you would have to prove that 457 BC saw a suspension in daily sacrifices. What you are saying is that the 2300 days/years, must begin with an elimination of sacrifices. In that case, you are saying that the 1290 days of Daniel 12:11 begin with the 2300 days/years.

This verse says that from the time the daily sacrifice is taken away, and the abomination of desolation set up, there will be 1290 days. Obviously the abomination of desolation ends when Daniel 12:11 ends. This means we would still have another 1010 days/years left, where the Bible contradicts itself. So much for your theory!

Jesus, in Matthew 24:15, refers to the book of Daniel, saying that the abomination of desolation had not been set up. Thus Daniel 8:14 had not yet been fulfilled, neither had Daniel 12:1. Your interpretation forces Daniel 12:11 to have already been fulfilled before Jesus. This time figure ends after the 1260 mentioned in verse 7. The New Testament regards the 1260 years as a future occurrence. I believe that the book of Daniel has many type fulfilments.

Daniel chapter 11 clearly speaks of Antiochus Epiphanes, however, the last few verses seem like failed prophecies.

I think the answer is that the king of the north— mentioned at the end of the chapter—is a latter day king of the north.

The king of the north is always

someone who invades Palestine from the north. Proof of this idea is found in chapter 12. The chapter begins by saying that at this time the time of trouble, resurrection, and time of the end is. Read the first four verses and you will see how clear it is that the second coming is referred to.

Since the New Testament regards the 1260 years as future, and thus the horn of Daniel chapter 7 as future. This horn is obviously different from the horn in chapter 8. However, as shown by Daniel chapter 11, the two horns are essentially one. Daniel chapter two speaks of the four beasts as one. I do not believe in the October 22 date, or the Investigative Judgement, but I do believe in the 1844 calculation. Please write back and answer these questions. Regards

I am about to leave on itinerary for a month, but I will say a few things. According to John 10:22 Jesus kept the Feast of Dedication which commemorated the cleansing of the sanctuary after its profanation by Antiochus. The last verses of Daniel 12 point to a final Antichrist doing similar things to Antiochus, and so does Matthew 24:15.

The Jews of Christ's day understood the abomination of desolation to be first of all Antiochus Epiphanes and secondly, pagan Rome. But 2 Thessalonians and Revelations 13-18 indicates it will have yet a final fulfilment in the future, as Daniel 11 and 12 also indicate.

See either of my commentaries on Daniel or my Glacier View manuscript for details and also for the reasons SDA scholars—almost as a whole— and **all** non-Adventist scholars, reject 1844.


So it was that many mission children at that mission school had the joy and fun of a Christmas tree the for first time in their lives, and received presents which they would remem ber

Radio News

Good News Radio (3BGR) Victoria, have been granted a permanent community broadcasting license (effective from July 20 1998) and have been on air since then with a twenty-four hours-a-day program of exclusively Christian music, ministry programs, testimonies etc. Unlike many other Christian broadcasters, they do not allow secular music on 3BGR. It works! It works very well despite the dire predictions made by the pundits.

Their transmission covers most of western Victoria, with good coverage from Ballarat to Halls Gap in the west, Ballan to the east, Bendigo to the north and Colac to the south. While there are areas within this huge zone where good reception is not possible, there are listeners from as far afield as Phillip Island (about 180 Km's distant). They are the first 100% Christian radio station to be licensed in Victoria.




